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ST DAY Youth Football Section Season 2019/2020

ADMINISTRATION/PARENT SUPPORT

St Day Football Club has become a big club within the local area and is consequently a major organisational challenge. There is an urgent need for parents to support the club or assist in fundraising activities. Volunteers are required to assist with coaching, refreshments, shirt washing, match referees and most importantly the setting up and dismantling of the pitches. Any parent willing to manage or sponsor a team is requested to contact the Chairman or Team Manager.

MEMBERSHIP & TRAINING FEES

Our annual membership & training fee is to be paid in one combined fee. Following the AGM on Monday 8th July, it was agreed to streamline the administration of the club subscriptions. The fees for the first player will be £110 and £75 for subsequent children. The membership fee entitles a player to all training sessions, club socks and shorts, waterproof jacket and registration to the Kernow Youth League. However, the fee now includes a place at the Christmas Party for each player, and each family will be guaranteed 4 tickets (2 adults and 2 children) to attend the presentation evening. The fees will go towards affiliation, training of coaches/managers, new equipment, trophies for the end of season presentation, the hire of the additional training facilities when required and most importantly anything that will aid the development of our children. There will be potentially 45 training weeks in the 2019/20 season. (Jul 19 – May 20 excluding 1 week in July for our Tournament, 2 weeks at Christmas & 1 in May for the presentation evening).

For those on benefits (i.e. Job Seekers Allowance or Income Support) the payment can be made in instalments - please contact the Chairman and/or Treasurer in confidence. Payment will only be accepted if accompanied by the correct paperwork and must be passed to the Youth Treasurer (Rachel Richards) or Club Youth Secretary (Clair Richards).

It has been decided to offer a reduced annual membership fee of £75 for children whose parents are Coaches and Committee Members of the club with the second sibling costing £50.

Please note that due to the club's insurance requirements, all players will be required to have signed on and paid their club fees in full by Saturday 31st August 2019. Any players who have not paid by this date will not be permitted to play for the club in any league or

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cup competitions in the Kernow League which commence on the weekend of the 7th & 8th September 2019.

Membership payments to the club can be via the following methods:

We will continue to provide a specific sign on fee depending at what point in the season a player joins - this to make it fair to all (Price includes membership & training fee):

Joining in December 2018 or January 2019 - £85.00
Joining in February - £70.00
Joining in March - £50.00
Joining in April - £40.00
Joining in May - £30.00

PLAYERS & PARENTS FINES

Please note that any players, or parents, that receive fines from the League arising from dissent to match officials or violent conduct, will be personally liable for the payment of those fines. Fines received for other offences will be paid for by the club.

INSURANCE

The club takes out insurance cover for all members for capital benefits (permanent damage); some parents might wish to take out private insurance for any alternative cover that they require. All managers/coaches will have attended or will attend an FA Safeguarding course and will take all reasonable care with the children in their charge.

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WELFARE & SOCIAL MEDIA

The club employs a strict welfare & child protection policy towards all children. The club, embracing the 21st century, also uses social media. All our teams now have Facebook pages which are closed member groups; this basically means only joined members can access the photos, match reports and information. There is also a Facebook group for the whole youth section which is a public group and a group that follows the adult section. Furthermore, there is a twitter feed which promotes information relating to the whole club. All of these sites are either run by a trained Welfare Team or where a manager administers the site it is closely monitored by the Welfare Team. When signing your child on you must make it clear if you do not wish for photos to be used on these sites.

Unlike any other club known in Cornwall, we are very fortunate to have not just an individual welfare officer but a team of Welfare Officers who work very hard to ensure that all players from U7s to the first team are able to play football in a safe, fun and friendly environment. These people have received further training to all coaches who hold a safeguarding certificate and are a mixture of male and females to help in all scenarios. Helen Bryant, Nikki Burrows, Lisa Clark, Jo McClelland along with the Youth Vice Chairman and Youth Chairman form the team here at St Day AFC. Should you have any concerns regarding the welfare of your child (or any other child for that matter – Safeguarding is everyone’s responsibility) then please contact one of the team using the contact details on our Facebook pages or on our website (all under the Youth section). Our website also contains links to agencies that are involved in child protection as well as all the FA codes of conduct, our child protection policy, guidelines concerning the use of social media & photography and our complaints procedure.

With regards to our complaints procedure this MUST be used as the ONLY route to register a complaint; please refrain from contacting your child’s coach directly via text, email or social media. A complaint can be made to the Chairman, the welfare team or any member of the committee following the guidelines as laid out in the official complaints procedure. Verbal abuse from a parent/carer or a child towards a coach will not be tolerated and will lead to sanctions being enforced.

As part of the signing on process all children have been asked to read, accept & sign the FA Respect Young Players Code of Conduct. This is to remind them of what the FA Respect campaign, and what we as a club expects from them as a young player. We will also be asking you today to read, sign & accept the Code of Conduct for Spectators and Parents/Carers.

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Let's work together to continue to make St Day AFC Youth one of the most reputable and respected clubs in the county and let's look forward to a very successful 2019/20 season!

KEEPING IN CONTACT

It is vital that when managers contact you as parents, predominately through Facebook, that a response is made to them as quickly as possible. If no response is made it will be accepted by managers that your son/daughter is not available. If your child still attends the fixture/event, unfortunately your child will not be allowed to participate. If your email or contact numbers change it is your responsibility to make us aware of this for welfare purposes. The organisation of the club, teams and parents is key to the successful running of this organisation so please co-operate in the above. When picking match day teams, managers will pick only the Kernow league maximum number of players for that league, players that have attended training and parents that have responded to messages on Facebook. In most cases, managers will select the required team number of players plus 2 or 3 subs maximum for a fixture.

Please note that paying your annual subscription and training fee does not guarantee matches.

CHRISTMAS PARTY 2019

After the huge excitement and involvement from the whole club year on year we will be once again holding a Christmas party for ALL players of St Day AFC. Players will get a gift that will hold the club badge on it, the past five years has seen football players receive club polo tops, club boot bag, water bottle all with logo and their own initials on. Furthermore presents have also consisted of a saints training t- shirt, personalised club socks and a club scarf. This year we will be holding the event **on Friday 6th December 2019** and Santa will be turning up and handing out all the presents to the children, the successful venue Raze the Roof, Penryn will be for our exclusive use from 7-9pm. The cost of this event is included in the annual membership fee. Additional siblings can take part at a cost of £12pp, this price includes siblings receiving an age appropriate gift. This by no means makes any money for the club – it is solely a way of paying for the gifts and the hiring of facilities.

CLUB LINKS, TRIPS & SOCCER SCHOOLS

Over the past five seasons we have gained a valuable link between ourselves, Plymouth Argyle FC, Exeter City & Redruth School. In the past couple of seasons we have ventured further and embarked on Premier League Fixtures at; Aston Villa, West Brom, Swansea and Cardiff. This

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season we will again aim to run a trip to another Barclays Premier League club along with watching Plymouth Argyle or Exeter City. The trips will almost certainly take place in January and February and more information will be available on our website and Facebook pages. It will be again made an optional trip as some youngsters may not be available to go and we also appreciate money can be an issue. With this in mind, we will be opening the trip to all members of St Day AFC and the cost will be made as small as possible by the club through our own finances and fund-raising events. It has been suggested by some that parents could use this trip as a Christmas present to players.

INTERNATIONAL LINKS

The club has created a very special link with AS DIRINON FC from France. The club is situated in a beautiful village near to Brest. After a fifth visit this year it clearly is a once in a lifetime opportunity for children and shouldn't be missed. Their annual international tournament held in around the Whitsun holidays is something special and another environment for the young children of our club to enjoy. The club has its own website www.as-dirinon.fr which is a must see. Over the weekend of 29th May – 1st June 2020, we will be taking our U11s who will take part in both the tournament and friendly matches along with other activities. The trip will cost approx. £300 per child but we will look to gain sponsorship and hold fundraising events to bring this cost down.

After the success of this year's trip we are going to look to take our Under 14s year on year. They will play a match in the stadium on Saturday as well as friendly matches against other local French sides in a club NW of Dirinon called Plouguerneau.

A deposit for the trips can be paid in the very near future and those parents with eligible children will receive information during the parents meetings at the start of the year.

THE CLUB

It is well known that many clubs do not integrate but operate as separate units. This club is very different from that. We are the envy of many and that's because the club helps you and in return you can help the club. We can all help by supporting fundraising events, Christmas Parties, End of Season awards and any trips the club holds. Everything we do is designed to benefit the club and create successful and integrated teams. Our facilities can be hired for business meetings, weddings, anniversaries, birthdays or any other special occasions, all contact details can be found on our website.

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THE CLUB KIT

All players who register with the club will be provided with a match kit consisting of socks, shorts and team rain jacket. Please note that the socks and shorts are ONLY to be worn for matches and NOT for training.

All players MUST wear shin pads to all training sessions and matches – failure to do so will result in the player being made to sit out. Please ensure that players are dressed appropriately for the weather conditions.

FA RESPECT CAMPAIGN

Please note that it is a requirement of the Kernow League that all Clubs adhere to the FA’s Respect campaign. Some things to note of the respect rule, all spectators at matches will have to remain behind a line/barrier that is at least 1m from the touchline on one side of the pitch only, with coaches/managers on the opposite side. No spectators are to stand at either end of the pitch. The campaign is aimed at removing abuse of players and match officials from the game and the pressurisation of players by coaches/managers and parents. Please help us to maintain the

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Club's reputation by recognising and applauding good play and sportsmanship regardless of whether it comes from the home or away side. The Club Code of conduct is available to read/download from our website.

As a club, we introduced a further show of respect from the children to parents and it was carried out very well but we would like to increase the emphasis on this during the forthcoming season. EVERY age group at the end of their match, home and away will give the parents and spectators a sign of respect. We as a club are asking parents and spectators to congregate together to receive an applause from the players. It will form part of their cool down where players will appreciate the spectators and dedication they have given to them.

The club will also continue with the initiative that all players and managers greet each other by way of a handshake before and after training. Again, it shows further respect and manners from all involved which are the fundamentals of grassroots football that this club strives to deliver.

SIN BIN

This year the FA have introduced Sin Bins to youth football, any youth player that shows dissent towards a Referee or Assistant Referee (Linesman) may be sin binned. This means the player might be shown a yellow card and be asked to leave the field of play for either 8 or 10 minutes, depending on age group.

Sin Bins in Youth Football 

From next season 2019-20 any youth player who shows 'dissent' towards a referee or assistant referee (linesman) may be sin binned. This means you might be shown a yellow card and you will be asked to leave the field of play for either 8 or 10 minutes.

So what is dissent? To avoid being sin binned when you next play take a look at the different types of behaviours which are classed as dissent.

- ✘ Clapping sarcastically towards the referee or assistant!
- ✘ Questioning the referee or assistant referees decisions!
- ✘ Making sarcastic or rude comments towards any match official!
- ✘ Kicking the ball away in anger!

Swearing at any match official or linesman is not dissent, but may result in you being shown a red card!

PLAYER FLIGHT PATH AT ST DAY YOUTH AFC



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INTRODUCTION TO COACHING AT ST DAY YOUTH AFC

The development of every child as a footballer and as an individual is our main objective. From the beginning we promise to do everything we can to ensure that this occurs in a safe and enjoyable environment. If you do, however, feel this is not the case then please inform a member of the coaching staff or the Committee. The FA Charter Standard scheme is designed to create the footballers and coaches of tomorrow with an outlet to adult football. The progression through the game formats is in line with the FA Future Game and England DNA strategy.

Training

We expect all children to commit to attending regular training sessions, lack of regular attendance could result in your child not being selected for matches (please refer to the players code of conduct on the St Day website, where you will find guidelines about what is expected from your child). If you know your child is unable to attend training, for any reason, it is essential for you to inform the team Manager/Coach.

We, as a club, view County training, or equivalent, as counting towards training attendance if this clashes with club training.

Under 10 years of age (U6s - U10s)

Rotation of players is the ethos that is used within the age groups up to under 10's. The reasons and benefits of this policy are: Firstly, it promotes harmony and reduces conflict throughout the squad and is fair to all concerned. Secondly it shows that the team is set up for the good of all, and not for the individual.

Every player deserves the same amount of time playing the game of football. It creates a group of players who all feel valued by the coach and all get the chance to develop.

10 - 11 Years of Age (U11s & U12s)

Rotation of players is part of the ethos that is used within these age groups, between U11's & U12's, however merit should also be considered by the coach. This promotes harmony and reduces conflict throughout the squad and feels fair to all concerned. It again shows that the team is set up for the good of all, and not for the individual.

Looking at Merit the benefits of using this ethos are:

- Players push themselves to train and play to their maximum potential
- Creates a good work ethic within the team
- Builds respect between players and Coach

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- Develops competition within the team that will help progress players

12 - 16 years of age (U13s - U16s)

Merit will be the ethos that shall be adopted by the coach the reasons and benefits of this are:

- Hard work is what the coach wants to see
- The games are competitive
- 100% commitment and effort is what the coach wants to see
- Winning is the focus and the players should be driven to achieve that goal
- Effort, commitment and application are required by the players from the coach.

Transition to Adult Football

As an FA Charter Standard Development Club, it is our aim to provide all our players a transition and outlet into adult football at every level of ability. St Day AFC offers three senior teams, with our first team now playing in Step 7 of the national pyramid after taking promotion this summer. We are looking to develop U18s and U21s teams in the coming seasons as players transition continues and managerial appointments can be made.

DID YOU KNOW? Manchester United won the league and the Champions League in 2007-8 without playing the same eleven in consecutive matches. Guardiola's Barcelona of 2008-9 made an average of 5 changes to the starting line-up in every league game. There is no secret; every team playing a high density of matches has to use rotation to maintain the level of performance, the competition within the squad and to avoid injuries if they want to get to end of the season with a chance of achieving their team and club objectives.

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CONCLUSION

St Day Youth AFC has come a huge way from its reformation in July 2011 and it will continue to be a club for the family and for the future. This coming season we will have more teams than ever before and of course more players. We are excited about the introduction of a girls section, something we have tried before but this time with Football Foundation funding and starting at a much lower age we are confident that we can succeed. The other exciting news is that we have applied for planning permission for an extension and we can hopefully start to build our extension and conclude the ReVamp of Vogue Park. We will introduce more, state of the art changing facilities and more rooms and better facilities for a supporters and community to use. What we will need, as always, is the volunteer help to get us underway before the trades are required to complete their skills. That said, if you have a trade we are keen to hear from you as the majority of the work is funded and therefore paid work is possible, we do not expect everything for free.

It cannot be stressed enough that the club is run by the members and if you have an idea that can be seen to better us all please contact a member of the committee. We have always and will always strive for our children to be the smartest on and off the field as well as the most respectful and this won't change. These small factors allow us to reach the bigger heights and if everyone buys into the true values of the club, everyone gets the chance to achieve. "We invest in our youth for the future of our community" is our other motto and we will continue, with your help to keep that as our aim. Keep up the hard work of supporting your child, other children and your community football club in everything possible and as a club we will look to do our very best and give them the very best opportunities.

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


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
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

Side Elevation





Front Elevation
